Maths The children can use their whizz.com maths subscription which will set work appropriate to their ability. See the guide and login in their home learning book.

Try some of the addition and subtraction number sentences on the Class Story? A guide to using 'real story' and 'number story' can also be found there. You could also make up your own!

Create your own shop and work out how many things to buy with £1. How much change do you receive? You could write down the addition, or then the subtraction (from 100p)

Our wonderful world- Wider curriculum

Keep cooking— Can you use the skills we have been learning in school to make lunch or dinner for your family? Be as imaginative as you can with the ingredients you have. Can you do this for 3 days in a row or more? What did you like? What did you not like? What would you change?

Geography— To continue your understanding of physical and human features, interview a family member or a friend over the phone about what they see in their area of the UK/World. Draw the features they tell you about. Could you then create a map of the UK/World and locate them on that map?

David Attenborough— Research David Attenborough and create a chronological timeline of everything he has done to help our wonderful world.

Make someone smile— Tell someone about your favourite story. You could, draw about it, write about it or record yourself acting it out. Send it to someone who may be feeling lonely at the moment. It could possibly be someone from the nursing home.

Motivating moments— can you create a piece of art and display it where passers-by can see it? Maybe you could write a motivational quote as well.
