

## Geography

Use the blank map of the UK. Mark Liverpool (the Beatles' hometown). You might want to research the geography of Liverpool a bit more: what are some of its landmark features? What else is it famous for? Consider its location ...why do you think Liverpool was such a cultural hub in the early 1960s?

Once you've done this, use google maps, online maps or an atlas to add in 5 other ports around the UK. Then add other places of your choosing on the UK... it might be places you've been, places you are interested in or places you'd love to visit (E.g. Wakefield! In Yorkshire!)

## RE

Had we been at school, we would have been investigating these questions in our RE topic. Discuss these questions around the dinner table, write some responses or spend some quiet time on your own reflecting:

*Imagine you have won the lottery. What would you spend the money on? Why?*

*What do you think "leading a good life" means?*

## History

In the 60s and 70s, Britain was at the centre of culture, especially in areas such as fashion and art. Find out more about this time period on the BBC bitesize website: <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/zh72tfr>

Your challenge this week is to design a piece of 60's/70's inspired clothing!

First, carry out a bit of research into a famous part of British culture from this time period. Ideas could be the Mini or beetle car, places like Carnaby Street or people such as Mary Quant, The Beatles or any other musician or fashion designer. If you wanted to present your findings, you could do it in the form of a spider diagram, poster or pin-board.

Use your research as inspiration to design a 60s/70s inspired outfit! Ideally, you might draw or have a photograph of your face and create the outfit underneath this but you can be as creative and inventive with this as you wish during this task... !

## Wellbeing and reflection

Listen to *Imagine* by John Lennon. What do you think his lyrics are trying to say? Create a piece of Art based on his lyrics or write an extra verse for the song, thinking about the time in which we live.

## Music

Spend some time listening to the Beatles on Spotify or YouTube. Pick your top three favourite songs from the ones you listen to and explain why you like them. There are lots of different styles of songs such as *She Loves You*, *Yesterday*, *Eleanor Rigby*, *All You Need Is Love* and *A Day In The Life* and many more to choose from if you wish!

## Computing

In the 60s and 70s, lots of inventions such as hovercrafts and the first computers were created. Can you find out about Tim Berners-Lee and his inventions that have shaped the world that we live in today?

## Science

The 60s and 70s was an era of space exploration - the first man walked on the moon in 1969. Can you remember the phases of the moon (think all the way back to Term 1 and 2!)? Can you create a diagram to show the phases, looking online to help you? Can you go outside to find which phase you can see? If it's dark enough, can you spot any constellations or planets as well?

You can choose to recreate the album with just 5 different people or as many as you like! The way you create this cover is entirely up to you - there are templates online (Google) - or you could draw it, make a collage. The choice is entirely yours!
