English (am) This week we are going to be studying Zog by Julia Donaldson	<p>If you have the Enchanted Wood by Enid Blyton, you could continue reading it. In chapter 6, the children meet Moon Face. Or continue listening to it here. <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=iPiOHF3g1AU">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=iPiOHF3g1AU</a></p> <p>Draw a picture of how you imagine Moon Face to look.</p> <p>What words would you use to describe him? Don't forget to use a thesaurus!</p>	<p>Moon Face has an amazing slippery slip slide that goes all the way down the tree. Imagine what it would be like to slide down it. Is it fun or scary? Maybe it's a bit of both!</p> <p>Write about what it would feel like or draw a picture and use some interesting words to describe it. You could use exciting, terrifying, zooming, exhilarating..... Don't forget to use a thesaurus!</p>	<p>Moon Face's slippery slip slide is a really quick way for people to get from the top to the bottom of the Faraway Tree. Can you think of another fun, but safe way?</p> <p>Draw a picture and explain your ideas to an adult.</p>	<p>From your design yesterday, write some instructions on how to safely use your machine or idea. Don't forget to use bossy verbs like put, sit, hold, slide and adverbs like carefully, quickly.</p> <p>Ensure you use a variety of conjunctions and, so, but, because, if, then, also.</p>	<p>In chapter 7, the children make some toffee for Moon Face. Can you think about a sweet or toffee that you would make for him? Write down your ideas in to a recipe or draw a picture and share it with an adult.</p> <p>Do you have the ingredients to make your sweet? If so, make and share it!</p>
Phonics (AM) Your child is working on PHASE 5	<p>Continue to login to Phonics Play. Username: <b>march20</b> Password: <b>home</b></p> <p>Rehearse all the phase 3 and 5 sounds: <a href="https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/4/f/lashcards-speed-trials">https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/4/f/lashcards-speed-trials</a> Make a note of the sounds they find tricky and that will be your focus.</p> <p>Teach- Choose one sound that is still tricky when you have been reading. Play 'My turn, your turn'. Display a three letter word that begins with today's sound. Sound-talk the word and then tell the child the word. The child should then echo what you have done.</p> <p>Practise- Choose a phase5 activity on Phonics play.</p> <p>Apply- There are some sentence ideas here <a href="https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/5/sentences-5a">https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/5/sentences-5a</a> Adults can either dictate the sentence or children can read it, try and remember it and then write it.</p> <p>Allow children to check it and spot mistakes without help.
