Can you remember how to tell the time and work out interval of time, for example 15 or 20 minutes before 3.15? Are you still able to use the 24-hour clock? We would also like you to review measures; do you know how to measure length, weight and capacity? Your challenge is to complete the measuring task on this week’s PE activity sheet.				
	Spellings – This week we are continuing to focus on suffixes. Look at the ‘Suffixes’ resource that we have posted on your Class Story. If you can, choose a rule for a few days or even the week and choose different activities from the spelling sheet to help you practice them.				
Physical exercise	Get active at least twice a day – see the ‘Englefield Challenges’ ideas on Class Story. Get outdoors every day! The government recommend at least 60 minutes of exercise each day.

English (am)	<p>I hope that you all managed to mark the 75th Anniversary of VE day in some way last week, we will be continuing to use this as a theme to develop our English skills.</p> <p>Have a look at the resource ‘VE Day Celebrations in photographs’ posted in our class story. Look carefully at the pictures and consider these questions:</p> <p>After looking at the people’s faces, what does it tell us about how they felt?</p> <p>Look at the backgrounds in the photographs; are all the people in the same places? Do they all look the same? Where are they?</p> <p>Are there any other clues that you have noticed that tell you how the people felt?</p> <p>Do you notice anything in particular about Winston Churchill, and the fact that he is doing something that now we would consider to be very unhealthy?</p> <p>What are your thoughts after seeing the people on the truck?</p> <p>Perhaps you could write a brief paragraph in your book answering some of these questions.</p>	<p>We are going to look at newspaper reports and write up our own version of a VE day report. To begin with look at the report ‘VE-day-in-Scotland-newspaper-report’ posted in Class Stories.</p> <p>Can you find all the key features in the report?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- headline- subtitle- reporters name- introductory paragraph containing the 5 w’s- what, where, when, who and why.- information presented in chronological order- picture with a caption- written in the third person and past tense- direct speech- reported speech- a short concluding paragraph explaining what might happen next <p>If you were going to write a newspaper report about your VE day celebrations what would your headline and subtitle be? Record your ideas in your home learning book. Or, you could imagine you were alive 75 years ago and write about the VE Day celebrations then.</p>	<p>Now think about the opening paragraph of your VE Day celebrations report. Remember you must include the 5 w’s</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">-What was happening?-Where it was happening?-When it was happening?-Who was there?-Why it was happening? <p>Remember to write in the past tense and include all your usual punctuation.</p>	<p>Today we would like you to talk to someone who was at your celebration (or who can imagine they were) and collect some quotes from them about the day. Next, you could write up the main events of the day/celebration and include either direct quotes (e.g. Mrs Jones, of 16 Acorns Drive, said, “I’ve never seen so many people having so much fun. It was just what we needed.”) or reported speech (e.g I spoke to Mrs Jones, a resident of Acorns Drive who told me that there were lots of people having fun. She felt that people really needed the celebration to lift spirits). Could you add a rhetorical question and have you checked that you have used formal language and the past tense throughout?</p>
